

Winchester People



Over 800,000 people in the UK have dementia and it has been estimated this figure will rise to over a million within the next 7 years. Dementia Friendly Winchester is run by a group of volunteers* who are committed to making Winchester a city where people with dementia can live well and feel confident in their local community. They recognise that a large proportion of the general public seem to have a misconception of Dementia and largely experience a sense of fear about this condition. These dedicated volunteers are trying to raise public awareness to change people's attitudes towards this condition, to enable people with Dementia to live a full life and feel valued here in Winchester.

Winchester, was one of the first cities in Hampshire to work towards a Dementia Friendly community. How long has the group been proactively raising awareness of the condition?

The group was formed in the summer of 2014 and on 23rd October of the same year Winchester became the first city in Hampshire to launch a Dementia Friendly High Street.

You can now find many other Dementia Friendly High Streets including Alton, Andover, Basingstoke, Eastleigh, Fareham, Fleet, Lymington, Lyndhurst, Milford on Sea, Romsey,

Our group has approximately 10 volunteers, most of whom are Dementia Friends Champions, which means that they have received training in delivering dementia

This month the Winchester Gazette talks to volunteers from Dementia Friendly Winchester whose mission is to encourage local people, shops and businesses to

awareness sessions to the general public. The people in Winchester have been very receptive to our work and we regularly hold awareness sessions known as Dementia Friends sessions at the Discovery Centre which have always had good levels of attendance.

become Dementia friendly.

Since the project started, how many local businesses have become Dementia Friendly?

More than 50 local businesses and organisations have become Dementia Friendly. All customer facing staff will have attended a Dementia Awareness sessions and as a minimum requirement first line staff should have a greater understanding of the condition including how best to respond to people living with dementia. All Dementia Friendly organisations are part of a local community that understand the need for clearer communication and patience based upon these principles;

- a good level of awareness so that people recognise and understand memory problems.
- clearly written information that can be easily understood by people with dementia.
- simple signposting so that people with dementia know where to go.
- support from others in similar situations, often known as peer support
- people who aren't afraid to engage with people who show signs of dementia

(Dementia Friendly Hampshire 2016)

Many have gone further to incorporate Dementia Awareness into their induction programme, meaning all new staff become dementia aware. Some have performed an audit of their building to ensure that it is also a Dementia Friendly and made changes to the environment to help customers who may have Dementia, for example installing better lighting or clearer signage.

A recent attendee commented, "I thought dementia was just about memory loss. The Dementia Friends Awareness session was really informative and has helped me appreciate how much more is involved." – Lucy, Shentons Solicitors and Mediators.

How do local businesses contact you if they are interested in working towards becoming Dementia Friendly?

We would welcome any new businesses who wish to become Dementia Friendly. If they are interested, the first step would be to contact Dementia Friendly Winchester by email using dementiafriendlywinch@ hotmail.com A member of the group will contact them with information on how they can be dementia aware and become a member of Dementia Friendly Winchester. Existing members are also encouraged to send any new employees to our regular awareness sessions to ensure all staff are Dementia Friendly.

Members of the general public can book to attend a free awareness session at the Discovery Centre which usually last between 45 minutes to 1 hour. Alternatively, we can deliver a session in house for the organisation who wish to become a member, for instance we recently delivered an awareness session at the Theatre Royal for its staff and volunteers. How does the general public find out if a local business or organisation is Dementia Friendly?

Organisations often display a dementia friendly sticker signifying that this particular business is working hard to create an inclusive and supportive environment for people with Dementia and their carers. Dementia Friendly members are listed on our website and we also have a leaflet with this information that we plan to distribute more widely in the next few months.

What would you say to anyone who may be thinking about becoming a volunteer with Dementia Friendly Winchester?

This is a great opportunity to get involved with helping to make a difference locally for people living with Dementia. We are a very friendly group of people who meet once a month and welcome anyone who is interested in volunteering. We need help with a variety of work including fundraising, publicity, running the website, administration, becoming a Dementia Champion or just helping out at events.



When is the next public awareness session?

Our next awareness session is on Saturday 5th November from 10.30 to 11.30 at the Discovery Centre. You can book by either going onto the Dementia If you live locally, you can find Dementia support by contacting the Dementia Advice Service in Winchester by telephoning 01962 884432 or by emailing dementiaadvicewinchester@ andovermind.org.uk. It can provide information and support from first diagnosis and throughout the journey. Dementia Advice Service, Winchester is a collaboration between Andover Mind, Hampshire County Council and NHS West Hampshire Clinical Commissioning Group.

Winchester Gazette discount Quote Ref: WG08 This month's Walk: Walking the Outer Sombornes

his month's walk tackles some testing paths in mid Hampshire and at a 'long' 5.5 miles could take in the region of 90 – 100 minutes to complete, for the regular walker.

It starts beside a set of thatched cottages in Muss Lane, Kings Somborne, just behind the General Store (photo 1). Suggested parking would be against the nearby fence.

From here we venture up the slope, past the cottages and onward through a small playing field to the left hand corner gate. We emerge in a layby opposite a cemetery, and turn right up the road for just over 300 metres. Be sure to keep tight to the right hand edge as there is no footpath on this busy road section.

Just as the road veers slightly left at a fork we take the signed footpath to the right. This path sweeps between two expansive fields and climbs steadily seemingly for ever (photo 2); in fact this is more like 1700 metres – always keeping straight up, not taking any of the side offshoot options.

The path soon wends its way through a short woodland for some 300 metres then just as it re-emerges with a field on the left, then we turn right through a single bar gate. Look for the yellow arrow path sign on the corner of this turn (photo 3).

There now follows a truly pleasant section along a path through a wood of deciduous trees and a hedge bordering fields on the left. This ultimately opens out onto a green swathe of paths where we again continue straight on, going upwards only as the land either side is private estate.







This path eventually leads up to a fence surrounding a large property; and here we turn right and immediately left down the signposted path and around the perimeter fence that drops into a fairly quiet country road (Somborne Park Road).

We need to turn right along this road, which climbs for the first kilometre, then drops again gradually – passing the entrance to Somborne Farm on the right and a short while later the drive leading to Little Somborne Church on the left. This road meets a busy road, Winchester Road, where we turn right and cross the road, carefully, and take the path into the adjacent field which takes us up an increasingly steep slope while splitting the fields around.

Once up top the view around Hampshire is stunning and provides full reward for the earlier climb.

In front of us is a post with three yellow path arrows where we turn right and begin a slow and gentle descent, meeting and crossing a farm track and keeping the barn on our left – we must keep straight on keeping to the right hand of the first field.

Just 150 metres down this field we cross through a gap into the parallel right hand field (photo 4); now tracing the left hand edge of this field, crossing a small ditch and keeping left as the path and field drop down to the right and join the main, Winchester, road.

At this junction we turn left up the road,

returning towards Kings Somborne, following the road round the right fork and down the slope towards the village. Our downhill trip is halted after 350 metres when we take the first right road over a water splash, which in winter would require the use of the walkers footbridge.

From here we walk uphill for only 150 metres as far as a swing gate on the left which is our footpath across a horse grazing field – straight across to another gate which we pass through and keeping the back gardens of local houses to the left and fields (once again) on the right.

In just 200 metres this path appears right beside the thatched cottages of Muss Lane and announces our arrival back at the start.

The reward refreshment lies back in the High Street at The Crown Inn where the weary walker will always be welcome.

Essential items for walking anytime:

- High visibility clothing, vest or sash are ideal. Be seen at all times.
- Robust footwear, walking boots, good sturdy trainers – normal house shoes not recommended.
- A torch (for gloomy days), mobile phone and a whistle (personal protection and safety).
- For dog walkers take a supply of poop scoop bags.





The Perfect Autumn Weekend in Winchester

During Autumn, it can often be difficult to plan something to do during your free time. This may be due to the England's changeable weather or the challenge of finding an activity that all the family can enjoy. Hopefully, this article will give you a few ideas for activities and events that are local to you, that the whole family can enjoy.

Walks

If you fancy getting a bit of Autumn fresh air, grab your wellies and a flask of hot chocolate and take advantage of the beautiful walks that are on your doorstep.

St Catherine's Hill

This chalky trail rises steeply to the summit of the hill at 97 meters, providing a brilliant view of Winchester. As well as the view, you will see that the top of the hill is ringed by the ramparts of an Iron Age hill fort. There is also a small circle of trees at the centre of the hill which contains the site of the 12th Century Chapel of St Catherine. It would be advisable to wear comfortable footwear and clothing due to the steep incline and muddy track.



The Millennium Trail

If you prefer a more relaxed walk, the Millenium Trail in Alresford is definitely worth a visit. The trail links footpaths around the town where you



will pass illustrated boards that give information on the history of Alresford, its inhabitants, wildlife and countryside setting. The walk is about one mile, however, you can branch off onto the Arle Valley Trail which takes you a further two miles. The Millennium trail alone is suitable for pushchairs and wheelchairs.



Events

If Countryside walks are not something you are interested in, there are many exciting events to look forward to in November, for all the family to enjoy.

Winchester Firework Display

On Saturday 5th November, Winchester will host

it's annual firework display and bonfire at the Recreation Ground behind River Park Leisure Centre. A torch procession will begin at the bottom of town and continue to the city streets, which will be filled with music and torch light whilst everyone walks to the firework display. The procession is unique to



Winchester and welcomes children of all ages so it is a perfect activity for the whole family.

Christmas Market and Ice Rink

From 18th November, Christmas begins in Winchester and the market opens. It never disappoints with its variety of stalls and a brilliant ice rink in the center for all to enjoy. So bring your winter hats and scarves, grab a cup of mulled wine and wander round the Christmas market.

Winchester Weekend Market

Every Friday and Saturday, Winchester hosts a

market with a wide variety of quality foods and good value for money household goods. It is open all year round from 9am to 6pm. I would highly recommend the Super Sized cakes which are excellent value for money and are perfect with a pumpkin spiced latte, Starbucks' famous Autumnal drink.

Flu

Flu is a common infectious viral illness spread by coughs and sneezes. It can be very unpleasant, but you'll usually begin to feel better within about a week. You can catch flu – short for influenza – all year round, but it's especially common in winter, which is why it's also known as "seasonal flu". It's not the same as the common cold. Flu is caused by a different group of viruses and the symptoms tend to start more suddenly, be more severe and last longer.

Some of the main symptoms of flu include: :

- a high temperature (fever) of 38C (100.4F) or above
- tiredness and weakness
- a headache
- general aches and pains
- a dry, chesty cough

Cold-like symptoms – such as a blocked or runny nose, sneezing, and a sore throat – can also be caused by flu, but they tend to be less severe than the other symptoms you have. Flu can make you feel so exhausted and unwell that you have to stay in bed and rest until you feel better.



What to do

If you're otherwise fit and healthy, there's usually no need to see a doctor if you have flu-like symptoms. The best remedy is to rest at home, keep warm and drink plenty of water to avoid dehydration. You can take paracetamol or ibuprofen to lower a high temperature and relieve aches if necessary. Stay off work or school until you're feeling better. For most people, this will take about a week.

When to see your GP

Consider visiting your GP if:

- you're 65 years of age or over
- you're pregnant
- you have a long-term medical condition – such as diabetes, heart disease, lung disease, kidney disease or a neurological disease
- you have a weakened immune system - for example, because you're having chemotherapy or have HIV
- you develop chest pain, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, or start coughing up blood
- your symptoms are getting worse over time or haven't improved after a week

In these situations, you may need medication to treat or prevent complications of flu.

How long does flu last and is it serious?

If you have flu, you generally start to feel ill within a few days of being infected. You should begin to feel much better within a week or so, although you may feel tired for much longer. You will usually be most infectious from the day your symptoms start and for a further three to seven days. Children and people with weaker immune systems may remain infectious for longer. Most people will make a full recovery and won't experience any further problems, but elderly people and people with certain long-term medical conditions are more likely to have a bad case of flu or develop a serious complication, such as a chest infection.

How you catch flu

The flu virus is contained in the millions of tiny droplets that come out of the nose and mouth when someone who is infected coughs or sneezes. These droplets typically spread about one metre. They hang suspended in the air for a while before landing on surfaces, where the virus can survive for up to 24 hours. Anyone who breathes in the droplets can catch flu. You can also catch the virus by touching the surfaces that the droplets have landed on if you pick up the virus on your hands and then touch your nose or mouth. Everyday items at home and in public places can easily become contaminated with the flu virus, including food, door handles, remote controls, handrails, telephone handsets and computer keyboards. Therefore, it's important to wash your hands frequently. You can catch flu many times, because flu viruses change regularly and your body won't have natural resistance to the new versions.

Preventing the spread of flu

You can help stop yourself catching flu or spreading it to others with good hygiene measures. Always wash your hands regularly with soap and warm water, as well as:

- regularly cleaning surfaces such as your computer keyboard, telephone and door handles to get rid of germs
- using tissues to cover your mouth and nose when you cough or sneeze
- putting used tissues in a bin as soon as possible

You can also help stop the spread of flu by avoiding unnecessary contact with other people while you're infectious. You should stay off work or school until you're feeling better.

The flu vaccine

In some people at risk of more serious flu, an annual flu vaccine may be recommended to help reduce the risk of becoming infected. A flu vaccine is available for free on the NHS for:

- anyone over the age of 65
- pregnant women
- anyone who is very overweight (with a body mass index over 40)
- children and adults with an underlying health condition (particularly long-term heart or lung disease)
- children and adults with weakened immune systems


An annual flu vaccine nasal spray is also now offered to healthy children aged two, three and four years old, and to children in school years one and two.

The best time to have the vaccine is in the autumn, between September and early November. If you think you might need it, contact your local GP surgery. All the Andover practices are now making appointments for flu vaccinations for patients in the at risk groups listed above.

Sometimes, for reasons best known to the greater universe, a friend will offer a suggestion to a problem that will seem ridiculous and pointless, but actually turns out to be the best piece of advice you ever received. This is exactly what happened

to one dressage rider after her trusty horse of many years started to be less responsive to her commands and her standard of dressage went rapidly downhill. Mentioning her predicament to a friend, Jo Simmonds, 49, was surprised to hear that her solution might lie in visiting renowned chiropractor, Nicholas Richmond of The Chiros Clinic in Andover, Hampshire.

Another aspect of the pelvis tilting was that the corresponding ankle and leg was clattering against the horse, reinforcing the unintended command to turn. When it came to introducing a command to the horse to turn left, Jo found she was having to pull on a huge amount of extra rein to get the horse to turn. Under these circumstances it was impossible for the horse to understand the rider and therefore get the precision they needed for the standards required in the dressage arena.

Although Nick has no experience in riding at all, his knowledge and interest in biomechanics (the study of the skeletal system and how it moves), meant that he knew, without asking, that she had an extra hole in her stirrup leather and how her horse had been behaving, just by looking at her. Amazed, Jo realised that this had not been a waste of time after all!

Nick was able to realign Jo's pelvis and spine and gave her some corrective exercises to complete at home to keep them in place. When Jo came back for her second treatment she was delighted to tell Nick that she had her old, trusty horse back who was doing everything that he should do because Jo was now able to give the correct instructions and commands to her horse. If a horse is musculo-skeletally healthy but the rider is not and they continue to ride together, the horse will eventually become imbalanced. Likewise, if the horse is out of alignment, this will transgress to the rider over time. In order to have the best possible performance from your horse, both you and your horse must be as mechanically sound as possible. This applies to all riding activities, from dressage to hacking out. Another client of Nick's, who is a professional dressage rider, always makes an appointment with Nick two days before each and every event. Taking this line further, it is therefore also essential to get your horse checked for musculo-skeletal misalianment too.

All riding is about strength, balance and posture. In order to get these right, a visit to a chiropractor such as Nick is essential, to ensure the rider is able to communicate effectively with the horse when in the saddle.

£1 Million Windfall Will Help Winchester Homeless

Two Winchester charities which support homeless people are to share in a £1 million windfall donation following the closure of a military charity.

Winchester Churches Nightshelter and Trinity Winchester will each receive £500,000 "to relieve the needs of people who are at risk of becoming socially excluded."

The story of the windfall is a tale of one man's vision combined with family heartbreak. But the money will enable both charities to expand their work with local homeless and vulnerable people at a time when demand for their services is becoming increasingly complex.

The charity (DEFLOG VQ Trust) began 20 years ago as a small project to provide vocational qualifications for soldiers to help them find work in civilian life. It was the brainchild of Brigadier Tom Blyth, then Commanding Officer of the Defence School of Transport.

"I could see that our logistics personnel in a wide range of trades, had valuable skills that were not recognised outside of the military.

"The new system of NVQs, later to become Modern Apprenticeships, gave us the means to provide nationally - recognised qualifications for soldiers." The project was first directed at the Army's logistic personnel but grew quickly to also serve the logistic trades of the Army's engineers, gunners, signallers, and of the RAF and Royal Marines.

Brigadier Blyth retired in 2000 and formed the educational charity, DEFLOG VQ Trust Ltd, with its headquarters in Beverley, Yorkshire. He has remained an unpaid trustee, sometime Chairman, throughout the last 20 years, in which the Trust has delivered over 35,000 apprenticeships and over 50,000 individual qualifications in nearly 100 locations across the world.

The Army has decided that this training will now be provided by a global corporate provider, and the Trust will close. Its assets will be distributed to other organisations including educational and welfare charities in Yorkshire and to military charities. The Winchester link is connected to the forthcoming move of the Army's Royal Logistic Corps to new barracks being built at Worthy Down.

But it is also testimony to the help, care and support that Brigadier Blyth's son Ben found in the City when he was homeless and suffering from a complicated and incurable mental health condition which eventually led to his death in 2010 at the age of 33.

A memorial bench on St Giles' Hill remembers him in the words "Gentle, kind and generous: he touched many hearts and found great kindness in this city".

Ben went to school in Dorset and to Peter Symonds College in Winchester before gaining an HND at college in Cheltenham. He was dyslexic, long before the condition was fully recognised and addressed in schools. Education and subsequent working life was not easy. His father continued: "After spending many years struggling to find his place in the world, he slowly and imperceptibly fell victim to the mental illness that would eventually claim him. For the final years of his life Ben made himself homeless, at first in London and later in Winchester.

Determinedly independent, Ben regularly refused hostel accommodation, medical intervention and government benefits, choosing to live a lifestyle where he was in control and able to make his own choices. After the harsh years on the streets in London he found help, care and compassion from the many charities that so distinguish Winchester as a place of Christian Charity, including the Nightshelter and the Trinity Centre.

In his last nine months he seemed to have turned a corner, becoming less insular, more rational, even saying that he didn't want to spend another winter outdoors... we hoped that he would finally accept help."

But it was not to be. Ben died in Winchester in the summer of 2010. His death shocked and saddened many people in and around the City. The Dean and Reverend Canon St John - Channell kindly agreed to hold Ben's funeral service in the Cathedral. The service was attended by over 200 people who knew Ben or who had professional and personal concern for people experiencing homelessness or mental health issues.



Ben's father concluded: "Ben's story is very complex, yet it is shared by others who are homeless today. Some have a background in the Armed Forces. Many are desperate and damaged by mental illness, family breakdown, poverty, and abuse. The trustees of DEFLOG VQ Trust and I are honoured to help Trinity Winchester and the Winchester Churches Nightshelter to continue their work in the city."

Nightshelter Manager, Michele Price said: "Ben was a delightful young man whose gentleness and kindness touched so many of the people who worked with him. His story shows how homelessness really can happen to anyone. Sometimes severe mental illness puts people beyond the reach of even the strongest ties of family love and support. We are seeing a huge increase in the number of people affected by complex mental health issues and if we can use this funding to alleviate that in some way it will be a lasting tribute to Ben."

Sue McKenna, Operations Director at Trinity Winchester said: "We are so grateful for this life-changing donation. The trustees of DEFLOG VQ have been long-term supporters of our work, and this sum could trans form the services that we provide to homeless and vulnerable people in Winchester. In times when it is

Chesil art project unveiled

An art project inspired by the Chesil Street area of Winchester has been unveiled.

Six large panels featuring the stories, memories and photographs of local people will be displayed on hoardings at the site of the extra-care housing development on the former Chesil Street surface car park.

The £4,000 community project called 'We found it in Chesil' was led by Salisbury-based artist Laurence Dube-Rushby and involved a wide range of local residents and groups.

These included pupils from All Saint's School, young people and staff from the Chesil Theatre, residents at the St John's charity, local businesses such as Chesil Rectory, Black Boy, Black Bottle and Sovereign Bathroom, local residents including the owner of Soke House who shared the history of the property and photographs of the historical features of the house, and local organisations such as Winchester City Mill, Winchester tour guides and the Hampshire Cultural Trust.

Laurence Dube-Rushby said: "It was amazing to discover a wealth of historical facts related to the Street as well as personal stories. Chesil Street seems like a whole separate part of Winchester with a real identity attached to it. I have really enjoyed the time I spent here with all the wonderful business-owners, residents, young people and visitors. I hope they like the designs as much as I enjoyed making them."

Cllr Caroline Horrill, Winchester City Council's Portfolio Holder for Housing Services, said: "It was a great pleasure to unveil the designs for the 'We found it in Chesil' community art project and to meet Laurence and the people who engaged with the project to make it a success."

The project was commissioned by Winchester City Council in March 2016 to run alongside the Chesil Extra-Care Scheme development that will provide 52 flats with a mix of one- and twobedroom accommodation for elderly residents in Winchester. It follows a similar project called 'A Postcard for Stanmore' which proved a great success.

Each of the designs is approximately 1.9m high by 3m wide so that they can be seen by passing motorists as well as pedestrians.
