## The driving offences people often commit without realisina

Every day, many people are caught drink/drug driving, speeding or driving while using mobile phones. Those crimes are well known, however there are other offences motorists may unwittingly be performing every day. Drivers have a duty to ensure they are operating within the law. The Highway Code is freely obtainable to keep drivers educated on how to use roads safely.

#### Here are just some of the rules you may have forgotten about.

- ! It is illegal to change your name and address and not tell the DVI A.
- ! It is illegal not to tell the DVLA of a medical condition, or disability, such as epilepsy, diabetes (all types,) strokes, neurological and mental health conditions, physical disabilities and visual impairments.
- ! On roads with more than one lane, drivers must stay in the left hand lane unless turning right or overtakina.
- ! Drivers must not throw anything out of a vehicle, including food and cigarette ends.
- ! You must not drive on a pavement, footpath or bridleway, unless gaining access to a property, or in an emergency.
- ! It is illegal to use a hand-held phone when supervising a learner driver, when stopped at traffic lights or queuing in traffic and when the engine is running even if you are pulled over.
- ! Drivers must not stop or park within 10 metres of a junction, unless in a dedicated space.
- ! Drivers must not park on a road at night, against the flow of traffic, unless in a dedicated space.
- ! Drivers must not wait on single yellow lines, during the times stated.
- ! Drivers must not stop to drop off or pick up passengers on school entrance markings.
- ! Drivers must only flash their headlights to tell other road users they are there - not to communicate with, or to intimidate people.
- ! Your car horn must never be used when your vehicle is stationary, unless another vehicle poses a danger.

- ! Children up to the age of 12, or until they reach 135cm tall, must use a car seat appropriate for their weight.
- ! A rear facing baby seat can only be used in the front seat when the air bag is deactivated.
- ! 60mph is the maximum speed limit for vehicles towing a caravan or trailer on a motorway.
- ! Any new drivers that get 6 or more penalty points, within two years of gaining their license, have to retake their theory and practical tests.







## This month's Walk:

## Circle around Rownhams by Malcolm Price

■his walk begins at a location with no pub or coffee bar to recharge afterwards, at Rownhams Wood, which can be found halfway between Rownhams and North Baddesley on the Rownhams Lane. As the road swings round a long bend (on the left coming from Rownhams), there is a substantial parking area



which is always popular with the local walkers.

The start of this 4.5 mile walk is very easy, but latterly underfoot conditions can make the route seem a little longer.

Once out of the car we head down into Rownhams Wood (photo 1) along a wide trail that gradually reduces into a smaller path and then climbs gently





through some woods. Inevitably, the winter rain can make this soggy but navigable and emerges into pine woodland and up as far as a fence on the left (photo 2) with a Hamsphire County Council 'Private' sign on the right. We need to go through the fence gap and turn right following the path round past a copse of trees planted in a circle.

This path actually tracks through the



grounds of Manor House Hotel and the next 800 metres of gardens, lake and shrubs are all part of their surrounding environment. We need to walk round the lake (photo 3), across the open field and through the gate into the hotel's extended car park. Keep going straight onwards towards the entrance gate which emerges on the edge of Chilworth Technology Park.

Taking care to cross this road we keep on the right hand side on the footpath for just 200 metres before turning right beside the Chilworth Arms, down Manor Road, past the Chilworth Playing Fields and then following the road round to the left as it becomes Chilworth Drove.

Once across the motorway bridge we are spoilt for choice of direction, with three options, our route is the sharpest left along the fence line beside the M27 (photo 4). If you can blank off the traffic noise this path is very pleasant for a long while until it drops down into rain washed gullies where there has been a lot of tree removal and coppicing. This has made the underfoot status challenging but not dangerous - and we need to persevere with this route for over a mile, by keeping the fence line always on our right hand.

The path joins a field on the right with a stream and woods to the left, which eventually meet a footpath finger post that aims us right over a gate and up through the next three fields, where cattle often graze.

The field can be surprisingly muddy despite being on the side of a hill, the left hand fence line probably being the firmest terrain! As we climb the fields Rownhams Services are just visible through the trees, but we are not going through them.

After conquering the muddy climb we mount the final stile, turn right and begin our return along Rownhams Lane to the car, which involves a 1 kilometre walk and a pleasant downhill stride to the car.



## **Essential items for walking** anytime:

- High visibility clothing, vest or sash are ideal. Be seen at all times.
- Robust footwear, walking boots, good sturdy trainers normal house shoes really not recommended.
- A torch (for gloomy days), mobile phone and a whistle (personal protection and safety).
- For dog walkers take a supply of poop scoop bags.

.... Wait... Stop! Do you feel as if you are in a perpetual, annual 'Groundhog Day'? Are these the same resolutions you made last year, and the year before and even the year before that? Maybe we need to approach this list from a different direction. # Sparsholt College Named as Plant Heritage's Latest National Collection® Holders

Sparsholt College's nationally renowned Horticulture department has added to its long list of accolades this autumn. Plant Heritage, the world's leading garden plant conservation charity, has named the College's apple cultivars, Malus domestica, as one of the latest additions to their National Plant Collections.

Bred and grown in Hampshire and the Isle of Wight pre-1960, Malus domestica are a geographically defined collection containing many rare apple cultivars, 13 of which are classed as 'Threatened in Cultivation' by Plant Heritage. The apple trees are grown without the use of chemical controls in an established orchard on campus, maintained and studied by Sparsholt's horticulture students.

Horticulture expert and lecturer, Chris Bird not only believes that this title is greatly beneficial to the conservation of plants, but also to the students who observe and use the apples as part of their courses. Chris said: "The knowledge and understanding of handling and preserving a Plant Collection demonstrates high quality skills which go on students' CVs. When they eventually progress from Sparsholt into the industry, they already demonstrate desirable expert qualities."

Sarah Quarterman, CEO of Plant Heritage, says: 'This new tranche of National Plant Collections illustrates why we value the

diversity of plants – in particular, their historical value to our culture. We are grateful to these Collection Holders for their dedication and the work they have undertaken to bring these Collections into being, and for conserving them for future generations."

There are currently over 600 National Collections across the U.K including Sparsholt College's full-status Malus domestica. The main part of this Collection was presented to the College by

the Federation of Hampshire Horticultural Societies in 1987 in celebration of their Silver Jubilee, as a living feature for students to use, study and cultivate. Moving forward, the College aims to add further geographically recognised cultivars introduced prior to 1960 to the Collection, including 'Sir Douglas Haig' and 'Lord Kitchener'.

Sparsholt College has a long-standing relationship with Plant Heritage, partnering earlier this year to win a Silver medal at this year's RHS Chelsea Flower Show. The College has a long history of Chelsea medal success achieving six Gold medals, three Silver-gilt medals, five Silver medals and three Bronze medals since 1998.

A number of Horticulture courses are offered at Sparsholt College, from Apprenticeships through to the FdSc Horticulture with Plantsmanship and Design. A leisure programme also provides ample opportunity for those looking to try their hand at a new skill or develop a long-held interest.

# University of Winchester scoops Times Higher Education Award for groundbreaking work with young carers

The University of Winchester has won a prestigious Times Higher Education Award 2016 for its pioneering work encouraging and supporting young carers to access and succeed in higher education. The Awards are widely recognised as the Oscars of the higher education sector.

The University received the Widening Participation or Outreach Initiative of the Year Award at a ceremony in London which was hosted by actor Richard E Grant on Thursday 24 November.

There are around 375,000 young adults in the UK aged 14-25 who act as unpaid carers for family and friends. Half of young carers report they are struggling with their studies because of their caring role, and without the right information and support they are four times more likely to drop out of education altogether.

During 2014-15, the University of Winchester worked with a number of different partners – including Carers Trust, Hampshire Young Carers Alliance, Hampshire Children's Services and the Princess Royal Trust for Carers in Hampshire – to pave the way for the higher education sector as a whole to increase support for young adult carers in accessing and succeeding in higher education.

The Award recognises work undertaken by the University's Widening Participation team including outreach sessions across Hampshire, on-campus events attended by nearly 200 young carers, and the development of a toolkit of ideas and practical advice written in collaboration between the University of Winchester, Carers Trust and the National Network of Universities Supporting Young Adult Carers.

The University has also supported Carers Trust to persuade the Office for Fair Access to recognise young carers as a disadvantaged group for the first time, and has launched an annual bursary of £500 to help young carers studying at Winchester to cover extra costs

such as frequent travel home.

The Award judges said that the University's work "directly addresses" the needs of individuals who "too often find higher education difficult to access and hard to complete".

"The University has led a multi-agency approach to ensure that every opportunity is taken to encourage young carers to succeed," the panel said. "The project has acted as a catalyst not only in making a difference for the individuals concerned but in securing wider recognition of the unique needs of these committed young people."

Professor Joy Carter DL, Vice-Chancellor of the University of Winchester, said: "We are hugely proud to have received this award in recognition of our work with young carers. As a University driven by a strong commitment to social justice, this important work is a wonderful example of our values in action. Our aim is that anyone who might benefit from a University of Winchester education has the opportunity to study here – whatever their background, we will help them achieve their full potential.

"Without additional support, young people with caring responsibilities could be at a disadvantage compared to their peers and the important work that our Widening

Participation team is undertaking is leading the way for other universities across the UK. We are incredibly proud of the work the team does and congratulate them for this outstanding achievement."

Sarah-Louise Collins, University Widening Participation Manager, said: "As part of our commitment to widening participation, we recognise young carers as a marginalised group and are making it a priority to raise the educational aspirations, awareness, confidence and motivation of all young carers, whether they eventually choose to study at Winchester or not. It's fantastic for our work to be recognised by a Times Higher Education Award."

The Awards were presented this week (Tuesday 22 November) at the Food Matters Live event at Excel in London's Docklands. The University won its award in the Schools, Colleges and Universities category sponsored by Thomas Ridley Food Service.

The FreeFrom Eating Out Awards were launched three years ago to raise awareness of the huge opportunities offered by 'freefrom' food within the food service sector. FreeFrom food – free of gluten, wheat, dairy, soya, nuts and other allergens – has become big business in the retail sector with an annual turnover already topping half a billion pounds.

The Catering department provides a wide variety of services for students, staff and external conferences across a number of catering outlets around campus.
